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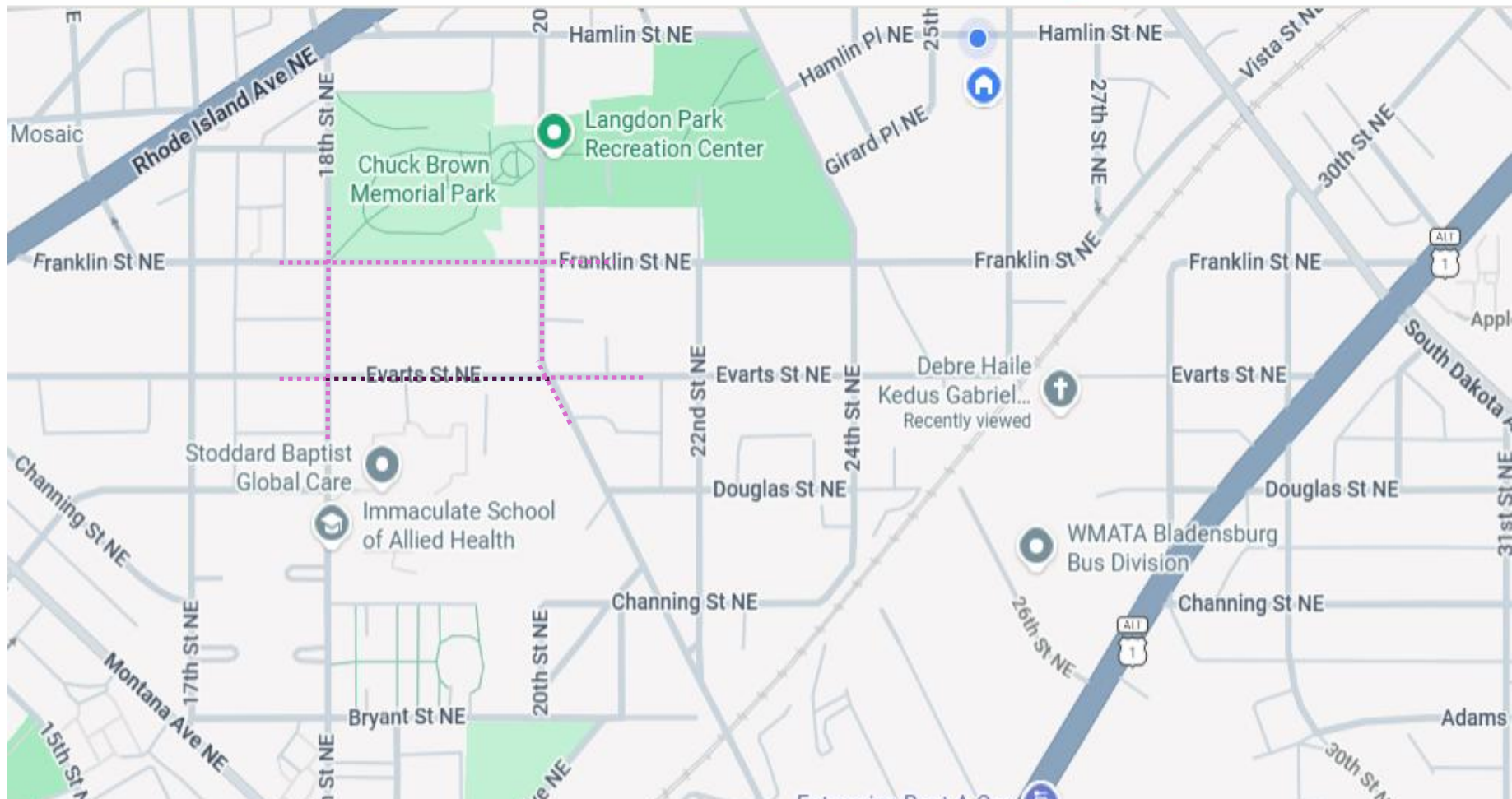

RE: ANC 5C Resolution Regarding the Langdon Park Community Center Modernization Process

Dear Advisory Neighborhood Commission:

DC Department of Parks and Recreation is in receipt of your approved resolution ANC 5C Resolution Regarding the Langdon Park Community Center Modernization Process, dated 1/15/2026. By way of this email, we are providing the following response to your resolution.

DPR acknowledges your ANC commissions request for a feasibility evaluation and cost-tiered analysis of the project be shared with the community. This work has already been completed and is considered deliberative and not available to the public. Thanks for your recommendations that DPR re-prioritize outdoor scoping toward high-use, durable, and year-round amenities and that any relocation or replacement of the skate park be of comparable or greater size, quality, and functionality. Furthermore, while, we appreciate the desire of the ANC commission to put this project on pause, we respectfully decline this request and look to work with you and the community to move this project forward on budget and schedule.

DPR appreciates your recommendation to increase the funding for the Langdon Park Community Center renovation. DPR takes a holistic approach in developing budgets to address the needs of residents in all 8 wards of the city. We will consider this request as we develop our capital budget for this and other projects. Residents who wish to provide input on budget priorities are also encouraged to work with their elected officials and to participate in the Administration's Budget Engagement Forums. These forums, which are typically held in February, offer great opportunities for residents to share their feedback directly with Administration officials.

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DC-DGS Intent to Purchase church property at 2715–2725 22nd Street NE



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“Engine 26 relocation (22nd/Franklin site acquisition)”

On December 29th, [DGS notified ANC 5C](#) of its intent to purchase the church property at 2715–2725 22nd Street NE as a potential new home for Engine Company 26 (E26), replacing its sub-optimally located facility on the 1300 block of Rhode Island Avenue NE.

The 22nd/Franklin property [previously housed E26 from 1908 to 1940](#), but is also known for unpermitted construction that [caused slope instability and sidewalk damage](#), issues that remain as DGS and FEMS consider reuse of the site.

While less environmentally destructive [than the previous proposal in the Queens Chapel Forest Patch](#), and further removed from the school and senior services, this candidate site is still a bit interior to the neighborhood and raises some concerns, particularly around emergency vehicle routing and what it might mean for traffic safety mitigations nearby.

At our January meeting, ANC 5C authorized me (VJ Kapur) to submit comments on behalf of the Commission, and I’m (VJ Kapur) continuing to hear feedback ahead of finalizing those comments.

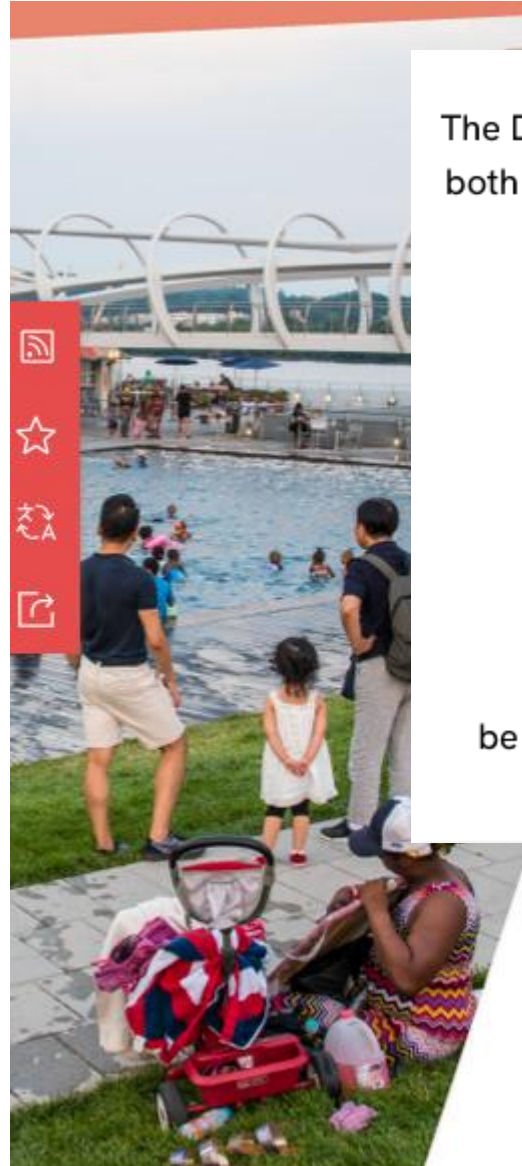
